"In the bleak midwinter ... a little light and warmth"

The 19th century Christmas Carol 'In the Bleak Midwinter', written by Christina Rossetti, speaks of Christ coming to a cold, hard world - but with its focus on the weather, perhaps the carol reflects a British winter rather than a Bethlehem one.

February can often seem to be a pretty bleak month. Christmas - even in the church calendar - is finally over with the celebration of Candlemas on Friday, 2 February (although we're stretching it out for another couple of days and celebrating with our Christingle Service on the Sunday - see details on page 4). The daylight hours, while beginning to lengthen, still seem short - often with leaden skies, frosts and wintry weather. The news from around the world looks likely to still be filled with the horrors of war and the plight of suffering civilians and desperate refugees - and the church starts to focus on issues such as sin and repentance, and stops some of the more joyful parts of the liturgy - as well as not having flower arrangements - as we move into the season of Lent.

But the reality is not as 'bleak' as it seems, because the truth of the incarnation - as told in this Carol - continues to speak into these experiences and makes the same call for a hopeful and positive response from each one of us.

As I enter what I expect to be the final year of my time as Vicar of Leek Wootton before retirement at the start of 2025, I am acutely aware that this is Christ's church, not mine. That the incarnation of God through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit is for every church member, not just those in recognised positions of leadership. As the children at the school know, the light of Jesus is not just for shining ON us, but IN us and THROUGH us. Everyone who claims to be a follower of Jesus should and can be bringers of his light - and with it, the warmth of his love - to others.

Even in the 'bleak midwinter', signs of spring will be showing as the snowdrops come to full bloom and the daffodil bulbs send their strong shoots up through the 'earth ... hard as iron'. As last year, Nicola will lead us (Sunday, 11 February, 2:30pm) on a walk to see the intricate wonder of nature, which reflects the wonder of the Creator, as shown in the huge variety of beautiful snowdrops, following which we will enjoy the goodness of God, as experienced through food and fellowship, at our Pancake Feast. I hope you will come and join us for this. There is information on how to book for the walk elsewhere (see page 30).

The final call of the Carol is to offer to Jesus the gift of our hearts – in other words to trust him with everything - including our faults and failings. As we enter the season of Lent, this is a heartwarming experience - knowing that this is all he asks of us in return for the gift of eternal life with him.



1918-1993 THE ANNIVERSARY MAP

If you have ever been into the upstairs room at All Saints' Church, you may have noticed a large print of a map of the County of Warwickshire, showing the churches, parishes, landmarks, history, roads and rivers which are all present in the Diocese of Coventry. (Those of you of my age will remember that until the 1970s Coventry's address was Warwickshire not West Midlands).

Christine Browne had a career in Ordnance Survey, was a Fine Arts student and mother of two when the challenge came to produce a map which should express the life of a diocese celebrating its 75th Anniversary.

In June 1993 Canon Guy Cornwall-Jones and I, along with other parish Cathedral Liaison Officers, attended the dedication of Christine's finished map at

Coventry Cathedral. We bought two of the 750 signed prints and I had them both framed, one for All Saints' and one for myself. Do look at the map, it is a fascinating collection of images which, if studied closely, will take some time to appreciate all the detail and understand the references, the architecture, the histories and the legends. Where Leek Wootton should be recorded, the words read 'This map depicts Coventry Diocese as seen from the 20thC'.

The Parish Council met on Wednesday, 3 January 2024, at Leek Wootton Village Hall. Discussion included the following:

RESIGNATION OF CLLR STEPHANIE ALLISON

The Council was sad to receive Cllr Allison's resignation in December and recorded its thanks for all of her hard work and commitment over nearly $3\frac{1}{2}$ years on the Council, especially her work on *Community Live!*

The Community Live! initiative was Cllr Allison's idea and she has worked tirelessly to bring together groups, clubs and societies for the benefit of the whole community. She has confirmed that she would like to continue to head this up, with the full support of the Parish Council, and this year's event is scheduled for Saturday, 7 September.

RECRUITMENT

Membership of the Council has been an ongoing matter for discussion since the elections in May 2023, when only 6 of the 8 available seats were taken up. The Council is now depleted to 5 and consequently the workload on individual Councillors means that it is harder to provide a meaningful service to the community.

BUDGET 2024/25

The Budget for 2024/25 was approved by the Council and the Precept set at £31,000, which equates to £58.04 Band D equivalent.

This is an increase on 2023/24, but having had a large number of unplanned expenses for various reasons (reports and legal advice to support planning responses, tree inspections and related works) over the last 2 years, which have depleted the Council's modest reserves, this will enable the Council to better respond to ongoing and future issues affecting the community.

DEVELOPMENT AT WOODCOTE (POLICE HQ)

At the time of the meeting, the Public Inquiry was due to resume on 4 and 5 January, and is due to sit again on 22 January at Honiley, with closing submissions scheduled for 30 January by on-line session.

The future and extent of the development of the site is dependent on the Planning Inspector's judgement, which will follow the conclusion of the Inquiry.

LEEK WOOTTON WAR MEMORIAL RECREATION GROUND CAR PARK

The Finance Committee laid out the various funds that relate to the recreation ground and car park. The Parish Council has agreements with the other stakeholders (the Village Hall, Sports Club and Trustees) that all four will make an annual contribution towards an ongoing maintenance fund.

In the meantime the car park refurbishment has developed a Phase II, being the installation and improvement of the lighting. The Council is also continuing to look into improving the bay markings.

The Council and Trustees also plan to install plaques acknowledging community involvement, including fundraised additions and trees that have been planted.

The Parish Environment Group will be leading when it comes to establishing the biodiversity areas, including the wildflower meadow.

COMMUNITY MAINTENANCE

The Council's grounds maintenance contractors have withdrawn from their contract, which was to run for another year, with effect from the end of February, so the contract will be re-tendered. This comes at an opportune time as the car park refurbishment requires variations to the contract.

Drain repairs in Hill Wootton have been undertaken and appear to have been effective, with the exception of an ongoing issue at the neighbouring property's driveway entrances.

The Clerk has reported a number of defective or unlit street lamps in The Elms and Woodcote Lane, and the Council has also been involved in discussions to investigate overgrown vegetation around street lamps, which diminishes the effectiveness of the lights. Please remember: if you spot a street lamp that is not lit, on during the day, or otherwise defective, please let the Clerk know, giving the street name and lamp number, and this will be reported to the appropriate authority for repair.

The Clerk also twice reported flytipping partially hidden in a hedgerow on Hill Wootton road, which was eventually removed.

NEXT MEETING

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be at 7:30pm on Wednesday, 7 February 2024, at Leek Wootton Village Hall.



Happy New Year from the Leek Wootton hogs.

The final numbers of hogs coming in for assessment and care here ended up at 318, about a third of all the group's admissions for the year! We are all hoping that 2024 won't be as busy, however, I have already had 5 hogs admitted. Around 15 hogs remained in care over Christmas and the New Year. Many of them are too small to be released yet, but

hopefully some will be if the weather conditions and temperature permit.

There will be many hogs hibernating at the moment in (as I write this) freezing conditions. If the weather warms up, as it is expected to, some may wake and be on the search for food. If you usually put food and water out for them, please continue to do so, you never know when they might need a snack to keep them going. If the weather goes cold again they may well go back into hibernation so topping up their weight will help them greatly.

I always try and update my hedgehog care knowledge and I recently attended a two-day international conference for hedgehog rehabilitators at Hartpury University. Eleven countries were represented including Denmark, Malta, Turkey, France and Germany where the European Hedgehog also resides. It was a great opportunity to meet and exchange ideas with fellow rescues from around the UK as well listening to some excellent presentations, on many

topics from treatment to conservation, from leading hedgehog researchers which will inform and improve what we do.

Spring will bring us some new challenges and new patients for sure and I will let you know more about how to support our local hogs in forthcoming editions of the Leek Wootton Link.



Can you help?

We know that in decades past Woodcote Lane was the site of high numbers of migratory toads, during the months of February and March. After spending 2/3 years in the East Lunch woods maturing, the adult toads would make their way across the road to the lakes



on Police HQ land. Sometimes the males hitching a lift on the back of the larger females; all in the hope that their sperm would fertilise the female eggs once they reached the lakes.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

If you drive along the lane in the evenings of February and March please take care and look out for these lovely amphibians. They are particularly fond of migrating when it is dark, damp and mild.

Either driving or walking, if you do see any toads, you can safely pick them up and help them across, just wash your hands afterwards. Please do send any sightings of dead or live toads to the Environment Group. We would love to know how our local population of toads is doing.
