# "Hallelujah! Christ is Risen!"

Easter Day may be past once we enter April this year, but the Easter Season is only just beginning. The yearly celebration of the resurrection of Jesus is not a quick affair - we keep it going for seven weeks, right up until the day of Pentecost which, this year, will be May 19. More about that next month but, for April, forget 'Fools' and 'Showers', and join in with us (or at least tolerate us!) being 'Fools for Christ' and rejoicing in the 'Showers of Blessing'.

This season means so much to me. It was the Sunday after Easter, 45 years ago, when I first understood just what it all meant as I experienced a deeply personal and both physical and spiritual encounter with the Risen Jesus, through the Holy Spirit. About seven years earlier, as a young teenager becoming disillusioned with the church, with life in general, and certainly with myself as a person, I had said to God, "If you are real, you know where I am." I didn't cut myself off from church entirely - Midnight Communion on Christmas Eve remained important - but life centred on playing Bridge, learning how to be - and then being - a computer programmer, and trying to get over the effects of the bullying (mainly psychological) that I suffered at secondary school. If anyone saw the recent episode of Death in Paradise. I certainly understood the portrayal of the long-lasting emotional damage caused by such school bullying.

But a chance encounter on a train a few years later with an old friend from infant school, while I was travelling to work, led to a string of events which ultimately got me to be a regular spectator at Billericay Town Football Club where a group of teenagers, a few years younger than me, 'adopted' me and, through their friendship and patience, drew me to their church for Easter Day and then, the following week, to a gathering where church youth groups from around the area came together for worship, teaching and fellowship. I felt so uncomfortable - this wasn't what I thought church was like: they were really enjoying themselves! But I was stuck in the middle of a row of people so had to stick it out, though I was not engaging with it until the moment when the speaker said rather suddenly, "there are some here who are closed to the love of Christ, and I pray that they will open their hearts" - POW! Who moved first - me, or Jesus? Either way, I had an amazing sensation like being hit by a wave which, rather than knocking me over, just flowed straight through me, and I heard a voice in my mind gently saying, "I know where you are, and I am real."

The rest, as they say, is history, but I knew the truth and it's why, throughout the Easter Season, I rejoice - and have fun - leading the Easter greeting in our acts of worship. These words aren't just part of the liturgy - they are words of life, and words of truth about my friend who had stayed with me, unseen, through my darkest times and, when I was ready, helped me to find real purpose in life and life-long friendships built on his love.

My prayer is that, over the years and maybe in the years still to come, I might have been used by God to help someone else discover the glorious truth that, "Hallelujah! Christ is Risen!"

#### **RUNNING LONDON MARATHON 2024 ON 21ST APRIL** RAISING FUNDS FOR MOTHERS' UNION



#### **CATHEDRAL ORIGINS**

The name Coventry may have originated from the word 'cofa', which is now cove, an early English word for valley, and tree may refer to an oak which was considered to be sacred. An early known spelling is Couaentree. A recorded history shows a seventh century convent founded by Osburga, which was sacked in 1016 when Mercia revolted against King Canute. However, he restored the nunnery once his place as monarch was secure.

A charter was granted to Earl Leofric and his wife Godiva in 1043 to establish a Benedictine Abbey, and Coventry began to flourish. The monastery was enlarged and by 1220 it stood high on a hill in the centre of Coventry. Holy Trinity and St Michael's, with its 300-foot spire, were also built. In the fifteenth century Henry Tudor gave thanks at St Michael's for his victory over Richard III at Bosworth Field.

The monastic community prospered, but in 1538 Henry VIII ordered the

dissolution of the monasteries and the building fell into decay. However, centuries later its neighbour St Michael's became a Cathedral when the new Diocese of Coventry was created in 1918.

The Three Spires of Coventry, St Michael's, Holy Trinity and Christ Church (of which, sadly, only the spire remains) are an uplifting sight and a testament to the skills of our medieval ancestors.

The Parish Council met on Wednesday, 6 March 2024, at Leek Wootton Village Hall. Discussion included the following:

#### COUNCILLOR JOY MORGAN

The first item of business was the co-option of a new Councillor, Joy Morgan. A resident of Leek Wootton for nearly 30 years, Joy has already been actively involved in the community for many years, with the Church, Mothers' Union, Macmillan and the WI, as well as initiating a support group for widows.

Joy's interest in local government has been piqued by the recent issue of the development at Woodcote (Police HQ) and her regular attendance at the Public Inquiry to follow the appeal process, "The Parish Council can only function if local residents play an active part and the paucity of attendance at the Planning Inquiry suggested to me that there is a severe shortage of local residents prepared to get involved in local government decision-making. As a local resident, I cannot expect others to step forward if I am not prepared to do so."

The Council is pleased to welcome Joy and the value she will inevitably bring to its ranks, and looks forward to working with her.

The Council has two remaining vacancies and is keen to fill these roles; at full capacity it will be better able to support the community. #### ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

The Annual Parish Assembly is a meeting of the parish electorate. It is not a meeting of the Parish Council, although it will be organised by the Council. The purpose of the meeting is to give the Parish Council, and other local organisations an opportunity to let local residents know what they have been doing over the past year. The meeting is also an opportunity for electors to have a say on anything they consider valuable to the people of the Parish.

In Leek Wootton & Guy's Cliffe we collate and present reports from local organisations in a written format, in order to keep proceedings moving. We also have a speaker and an open forum, which gives electors an opportunity to raise issues or ask questions.

For the 2024 Assembly the Parish Council we will not have a speaker, but the forum will be looking at the subject of the development at Woodcote and outcome of the Appeal [as yet unknown] and what the next stages of the planning process may be. For the agenda, see page 19.

#### DEVELOPMENT AT WOODCOTE

At the time of the meeting the Council was still awaiting the Planning Inspector's report/decision.

#### LEEK WOOTTON WAR MEMORIAL RECREATION GROUND CAR PARK

On 6 March a new lamp post was installed to light the north east part of the car park. The existing lamps were also replaced with LED lights. This completes Phase II of the car park refurbishment project.

Preparations for the Biodiversity Project are under way, with the Parish Environment Group and Scout Group being involved. The project will include a wildflower meadow, installation of bat boxes and sparrow terraces, and planting new native trees.

#### FIBRE TO THE PREMISES [FTTP] BROADBAND

Some time ago the Parish Council attempted to establish a project to improve the broadband provision with BT Openreach in Leek Wootton. This proved a challenge to just establish the parameters of the project as Openreach repeatedly drew massive areas, including many addresses that are outside of the Council's jurisdiction. The last time the Council attempted to restart the project it was advised to wait until the conclusion of Project Gigabit and the Department of Community Media and Sport [DCMS] review of the gigabit voucher scheme.

The Council is aware that there are many residents who continue to experience issues and is now revisiting this project to investigate the best way to proceed.

#### TRAFFIC SPEED

The Community Speed Watch group now has 4 sites approved for observation sessions. If you are interested in joining the Community Speed Watch group, please contact the Clerk.

The Council has no further news on the progress of the 20mph zone outside the school. Similar schemes are being rolled out at schools throughout the county and this may take a number of months to be completed.

#### COMMUNITY MAINTENANCE

- A resident raised the issue of litter around the sliproad to the A46, southbound
  after the Gaveston roundabout. In addition to the general litter, are the
  discarded WCC Highways 'easels', which they appear to treat as disposable.
  The condition of this area has been raised with WCC Highways and WDC
  Contract Services and this should be cleared by the end of March.
- Concern was expressed about the condition of trees in a number of places around the parish, particularly following a couple of incidents of falling trees and branches. Whilst March to August is bird nesting season and hedges and trees cannot be cut back, property owners should be aware of the condition of trees and the potential risk of a falling tree or branch to the public.
- Following a resident's complaint, posters have been placed around the Recreation Ground to remind dog walkers to bag and bin dog waste - the Recreation Ground is a community recreation space and leaving dog faeces where there are football pitches marked out is not acceptable - it is a health hazard! The PC would like to thank the community-minded people who not only clear their own dogs' waste, but other people's dogs' waste when they see it.

#### **DISTRICT & COUNTY COUNCIL NEWS**

Our District and County Councillors attend Parish Council meetings and on this occasion were keen to relay information about the WDC Household Support Grant,

to which families and households in Warwickshire can apply, whether they use prepayment meters, pay by direct debit or on receipt of a bill. Residents are invited to contact the local welfare scheme team for confidential discussion.

In a last-minute change to our programme, the talk at our March meeting was 'Hands of Genius', given by Graham Short. A Birmingham lad, Graham is considered one of the most talented artists in the world, his completed masterpieces being collected by fine-art enthusiasts and housed at some of the world's most desirable homes, galleries, and museums. Graham has completed just forty-eight pieces in his lifetime, and he only produces four items per year, which seems a very small number until one understands that Graham is a micro-engraver; his 'signature piece' - completed in 2023

engraving of The Lord's Prayer on a speck of gold inside the



An entertaining and fluent speaker, Graham described to us his unconventional modus operandi - working under a microscope through the night when traffic vibration outside his home is eliminated, and taking a cocktail of substances to lower his heart rate so that his hands remain steady. His talk was peppered with amusing anecdotes of 'the great and the good' he has met during his life in the art world, as well as the story behind his project of November 2016 when he engraved Jane Austen's portrait on four new £5 notes and spent them in small locally owned businesses across Great Britain. This project, like much of Graham's work, attracted media interest around the world.

Perhaps the most thought-provoking aspect of Graham's talk was his reference to his English teacher who encouraged Graham and his friends to dare to think differently to make their mark on the world. With Jeff Lynne, Ozzie Osbourne and Jasper Carrot among Graham's peers at school, Mr Jennings' words clearly had an impact on more than Graham alone!

The Club met on Tuesday, 18 March at the Sports Club where, after a short Club Business session, the meeting moved on to the talk by Hazel Carter entitled 'Life's Good - it's the disease that's the problem'.

When Hazel's husband, Alan, was diagnosed with amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), the most common form of motor neurone disease (MND) it was, of course, devastating news, but it did not stop the couple in their tracks. With short-term life expectancy and no hope of a cure it spurred them on to take that already planned lifetime dream holiday to Vietnam, other holidays around the UK and to enjoy numerous social events, while Alan's body started to fail. He died in Hazel's arms in 2019.

Hazel's talk took us through the difficulties she faced caring for Alan and how help was forthcoming. How their love for each other kept them strong. She shared her private thoughts and feelings and tips she learnt from the experience. When Covid struck in 2020, she was newly widowed but turned to her diaries and wrote a book telling her story, which she has published and sells for charity with all proceeds going to the MND Association, Marie Curie and Myton Hospices.

Hazel is now a Board Trustee of the MND Association, a volunteer for Marie Curie and in March 2023 she was a finalist for the Inspirational Women Award and won Inspirational Author Award from the Ladies First Professional Development network, for her book. In 2022 she donated a kidney to her brother to help save his life and they both enjoy good health today.

# LEEK WOOTTON HEDGEHOGS

There has been a steady trickle of hogs through our doors since the beginning of the year as well as our overwintering patients – around 100 – thankfully not all with me! We have been extremely thankful for our wonderful team of foster carers who have looked after hogs as they slumbered their way through most of the winter, although not all of them decided to hibernate, taking some of the pressure off the main rescues for a while.

As the weather starts to improve, we are managing to get those who are ready for release back out to their homes. There has been a steady increase in activity at feeding stations and many reports of huffing noises

around the garden as the males and females meet up for the first time in a while!

If you have stopped putting food out for them, now is a good time to start again as they will need access to supplementary food until their natural food sources get established. As you may have read before, contrary to popular belief, slugs and snails (in abundance at the moment it seems) are not part of a hog's regular diet. But, if they are the only food sources around, they will eat them. The trouble is that slugs and snails carry a natural parasite that will transfer to a hog and make them very ill. These parasites are a significant cause of our admissions throughout the year, especially in the spring and autumn. Dried kitten biscuit is the best food to put out for them.

As you go about in the garden, please be aware that there will be hogs in their natural nesting spots - under log piles, in the bottoms of dry hedgerows and in thick bundles of leaves and other debris. If you come across a hog, please cover it back up with the nesting materials and leave well alone. Hogs will also rest and make nests under sheds, outbuildings and piles of wood so if you are considering any renovations, please look out for them.

You may also be tempted to do some strimming. If you do, please check the areas for any wildlife before you start as, sadly, we see so many nasty injuries

as a result of them.

Whilst most hogs will have coped well over winter, things that may concern you if you do see a hog are:

- Out during the day (dawn and dusk are OK though)
- Looking skinny/thin
- A significant and visible dip behind the head
- 'Walking high on their legs' rather than sweeping along low to the ground
- · Being pestered by birds
- Flies buzzing around them
- Covered in lots of ticks (more than 10 is a concern)
- (grey/blue/white 'lumps' sitting between the spines and around the face)
- · Wobbly or limping
- Going round aimlessly in circles
- Obvious signs of injury
