"I lift up my eyes to the mountains"

These are the opening words of Psalm 121, a psalm much loved by many people – especially those who love to walk in the hills and the mountains.

Maybe you have visited the Swiss Alps. I go regularly as part of my work. "Why does the Vicar of Leek Wootton have to go to work in the Swiss Alps?" I hear some of you saying! Well, many of you know that I am only part-time in my role as Vicar here. I have another job too, working as the 'Short-Term Mission Manager' for the Intercontinental Church Society (ICS), which is one of the mission agencies of the Church of England and is based in Coventry. In a previous post, linked with ICS, I was the full-time Chaplain of the English Church in Lyon, France, but in in my current part-time role, I am responsible for organising the teams of volunteers who offer to spend two or more weeks working among the English-speaking tourists, resort workers and local residents in various popular destinations in Europe. Just at the moment, the list of venues is fairly small but there have been many more in the past and we hope that there will be more again in the future. However, two places that are firmly established are the Alpine villages of Zermatt and Wengen. There, ICS established English churches long ago, and continue to maintain these



buildings as living churches throughout the summer and winter seasons – roughly 9 months of the year. Anglican clergy and lay ministers go as volunteer Chaplains to offer pastoral care, to share the Gospel message and to run services – and my role is to organise these teams, to recruit, to equip, to support them – and also to ensure the good state of the church buildings and the Chaplain's accommodation. It is this latter part of the job which often sees me head out to Switzerland during the spring or autumn breaks.

The church in Wengen (St Bernard's - above) was built in 1928 and so is nearing its centenary, and the one in Zermatt (St Peter's - below) was built in 1870 and we celebrated 150 years there in 2021 [it was organised for 2020, but you may remember that something happened that year!] Set among the majestic mountains of the Jungfrau region and the Matterhorn region, thousands come each year from

around the world to 'lift up their eyes to the mountains' – but our churches are there to give people an opportunity to understand the next part of the psalm more fully. This psalm encourages us to look beyond the hills and mountains – beyond creation – and to discover the caring love of the creator:

"I lift up my eyes to the mountains – where does my help come from? My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth."

If you find yourself in one of these beautiful places, please take a moment to visit the English Church there.



and perhaps come for a Sunday service too. And ponder for a moment the 'Leek Wootton Link!'


From Coventry Cameos by Eric Benjamin Bramwell, 1977:

"The earliest record we have of a Coventry chapel dedicated to St Michael is of a charter granted in 1150 by Ranulf, Earl of Chester, in the reign of King Stephen, to Prior Laurence and the monastery of St Mary. Situated in the Earl's-part of Coventry, along with other chapels dotted around the town.

Between 1279 and 1293 the vicar of St Michael's granted the land where St Mary's Hall now stands to a Willia Cole, of Coventry, on condition that he and his heirs paid for lamp to be kept burning day and night, before the High Altar in St Michael's Church.

The south porch with its trefoil arch, and the west crypt, were both built about 1300. They are the only remaining parts of the church of the date."

The Parish Council met on Wednesday, 1 May 2024, at Leek Wootton Village Hall. Discussion included the following:

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL

The first meeting was the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council, which is the equivalent of an AGM for the Council. First item on the agenda is always to elect the Chairman for the next year and Cllr Richard Coates was duly elected, with Cllr Paul Eldridge as Vice-Chairman.

Other business of the Annual Meeting included:

- Review of committees, groups or working groups
 Cllr David Elsy joined the Finance Committee and the future establishment of
 a LWWMRG Car Park Maintenance Working Group was discussed, which will
 include representatives from the four stakeholder groups (this was not
 considered an immediate priority, as the car park will not require immediate
 maintenance).
- Review of Policy and Strategy Documents
 The Council agreed to adopt the NALC Civility & Respect Pledge.
- Review of Councillors' Areas of Interest
 Cllr Joy Morgan joined the Community Development Group and volunteered
 to have the school as an Area of Interest. Starting as she no doubt means to
 go on, Joy has already identified a need/want in the community for CPR
 training and is organising a session or series of sessions in the Autumn that
 will be open to all watch this space for further information.

COMMUNITY GRANT SCHEME

The Parish Council's Community Grant Fund is a small fund for "not for profit" organisations or voluntary community groups to develop parish facilities and benefit residents (not individuals). Two awards have been approved so far this year (since 1 April):

- Leek Wootton Village Hall Ltd was given £96.98 towards solar lights for pedestrians
- Leek Wootton Cricket Club was given £300 towards new cricket nets

DEVELOPMENT AT WOODCOTE (POLICE HQ)

The Council is still waiting for a decision following the Planning Inquiry, which finished in February, and has asked the Planning Inspectorate for further

information. The PI understands that Warwick District Council's recent adoption of the requirement for a Net Zero Carbon Development Plan Document [DPD] means that the applicant, CALA Homes, will need to provide a DPD before any approval could be given, causing additional delays.

BROADBAND

The Council has continued to try to get answers to the Community Fibre Partnership [CFP] questions from Openreach and eventually received a response that the original CFP that the Council was trying to negotiate was "unable to secure funding". The Council does not believe this statement is accurate, because it immediately responded to the 'final offer' to say the address list was not correct – it included 130 addresses that were outside the parish, despite repeated efforts to compile a correct list. The response from Openreach in January 2023 was to "revisit this when the project gigabit scheme [review] has concluded", but no further contact was received. Unfortunately the only suggestion from Openreach to revive the scheme was that, "interested parties re-register their interest". However, following further research, the Gigabit Voucher Scheme is no longer available in Warwickshire, which is how the original scheme would have been funded; by interested parties 'pooling' their gigabit vouchers (up to £4,500 per premises) to fund the infrastructure project.

HOWEVER, all is not lost! In its frustration the Council contacted the Warwickshire County Council Portfolio holder for Economy following publicity surrounding a contract signed with CityFibre under the Government's national Project Gigabit rollout.

The Council has been informed that 283 dwellings within the parish are due to be upgraded to 'gigabit capable' connections through a Project Gigabit build programme that will be overseen by WCC and CSW Broadband. The Project Gigabit build programme has been drawn up between the Government's Building Digital UK [BDUK] and CityFibre, so WCC and CSW Broadband have no influence over the schedule. "Between BDUK and CityFibre they have agreed that it makes logical sense for CityFibre to start their deployments from areas where they already have existing fibre exchanges. So, the first areas of Warwickshire to benefit will be parts of North Warwickshire and Rugby district where network will be built from CityFibre's existing fibre exchanges in Coventry and Rugby. This means that areas like Leek Wootton may not benefit for 2 or 3 years. It will be coming to the parish - just not yet."

The Parish Council does therefore not propose to re-register interest in a CFP with Openreach at this time. BIODIVERSITY SCHEME

Weed suppressant sheeting has been placed over part of the car park biodiversity area and the Parish Environment Group has been planting plug plants and tree whips according to the biodiversity plan. Working with the Guides and Scouts, there will be further activity including installing bat boxes, sparrow terraces and bird boxes. *Read more about the Big Help Out on page 11*.

COMMUNITY MAINTENANCE

The Council continues to liaise with WCC Highways regarding flooding and other condition issues as and when they occur, but is forever grateful for residents' assistance – if you spot a pot hole or flooding problem on the public highway, please report it straight away – either contact the Clerk (clerk@leekwootton.org.uk) stating the issue and location, or register the issue at www.warwickshire.gov.uk/reporthighwayproblem.

The condition of pavements throughout the parish were identified as a particular concern and the Parish Council is undertaking a survey, compiling a list of particular issues, to raise this with WCC Highways. If you wish to highlight a pavement problem near you, please send locations and photos to the Clerk.

WARWICK DISTRICT COUNCIL COMMUNITY HUB

WDC's Customer Service Operations have officially relocated to the Royal Pump Rooms 'Service Hub' in Leamington and will be open from Monday to Friday from 9:30am to 4:30pm, offering residents in-person support and advice on a range of Council services. There are also private areas available for one-to-one meetings

NEXT MEETING

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be at 7:30pm on Wednesday, 5 June 2024, at Leek Wootton Village Hall.

All Parish Council Meetings are open to the public. There are currently two vacancies on the Council – if you would like to make a difference in the community, please come along to a meeting and find out more!


The Joy of Teddy Bear Parachuting

Harriet's Mammoth Challenge

Dr Harriet McGrath, an oncology registrar in London, is currently taking on a mammoth challenge for charity in memory of her dad, Simon, who lived in Leek Wootton for nearly 30 years.

Harriet is cycling from London to Lati in Finland, a distance of around 1,250km. In Finland, she will then take on a 110km ultra marathon. She set off from Tower Bridge in London on May 12 and will be taking part in the ultra marathon on 25 May.

Harriet said: "When I last raised money in memory of my Dad, I'd taken on a 250km run, which meant that this time I felt like it needed to be even bigger or somehow different."

As well as being in memory of her dad, Harriet's challenge will raise money for the **Ruth Strauss Foundation**, set up by former England cricket captain, Sir Andrew Strauss, to raise awareness of the need for more research & collaboration in the fight against non-smoking lung cancers, an area of research Harriet has been involved in.



The Kenilworth Probus I Club met at the Sports Club on Tuesday, 21 May. Following some Club business the Chairman, Brian Wilson, made a presentation to Mike Cheeseman, who retired as Club Secretary at the recent AGM, marking his many years of service, keeping the Club in good order.





in the Diocese of Central Tanganyika (DCT) on 'Helping Women Subsistent Farmers in Tanzania'. After giving a brief rundown of his working career from the Merchant Navy through Massey Fergusson, Yale Trucks, DTi, and IBM to his recent retirement, he added that for the last ten years he had volunteered with the small *Fast No More* charity.

The charity works in the Diocese of Central Tanzania, which is an Anglican diocese covering an area of 400km x 300km based around Dodoma, with a population of 1m and 30 Vicars, in a dust bowl with subsistent farmers. *Water Aid* has provided standpipes for water, but it takes a 3 to 5 mile walk to collect wood for fires.



One Fast No More project is to persuade women farmers to give up 20% of their crop growing land to plant non-edible plants that can be used to fertilise the edible crop land. The effect of this policy increases the

Nomore edible crop land. The effect of this policy increases the yield of the edible crops by double and if 40% is given up it can increase edible crops by 4 times. They are also encouraged to focus their planting to facilitate efficient watering.


Another scheme is encouraging Airtight Crop Storage to stop the loss of stored crops to insects. This scheme encourages the digging of a pit in the floor of their dwelling, lining it with heavy duty plastic and filling with the grain, covering with plastic and earth, thus suffocating the insects, and reducing losses by 30%. £50 is the cost of creating an Airtight Crop Storage unit.

The charity pays a trainee £375 per year, to train local farmers, who then in turn train others, resulting in upwards of 6,000 lives being improved.

Finally, there is a project to introduce 2-wheel tractor units to provide some simple mechanisation to help the women farmers. Each tractor costs around £3,000.



- 2/14 and 66 not out (which included 16 from the final over!) from new signing Matt Edwards




